THE USAID GLOBAL HEALTH SUPPLY CHAIN PROGRAM

The **USAID Global Health Supply Chain** includes six projects to strengthen health supply chain systems. The Procurement and Supply Management project specifically provides commodity procurement and logistics services, strengthens supply chain systems, and promotes global collaboration.

Procurement and Supply Management

To improve the procurement and shipping of health commodities and build sustainable country systems.

Rapid Test Kits

To improve the procurement and shipping of HIV rapid test kits.

Technical assistance

Provides technical assistance on supply chains to strengthen country systems.

Innovations and Research

Conducts research and development for health supply chains and related commodity and security issues.

Quality Assurance

provides quality assurance for procured commodities as well as technical assistance to strengthen country systems to do the same.

Business Intelligence and Analytics

collects and integrates data across programs to support the program's management and coordination.

We Support U.S. Global Health Agenda

- HIV via U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR)
 - AIDS-Free Generation
 - Test and START and 90-90-90 treatment goals
- Malaria via President's Malaria Initiative (PMI)
 - By 2020
 - Reduce mortality by 40 percent
 - Eliminate in at least 20 countries
 - Prevent re-establishment in all malaria-free countries
 - Total elimination longer-term
- Population and Reproductive Health via USAID Global Health
 - FamilyPlanning2020 Goals (FP2020)
 - Reach additional 120 million women and girls with modern contraception by 2020
 - Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)
 - Meet at least 75 percent of family planning demand with modern contraception by 2030

Strong Supply Chains to Save Lives

 - \$10.5 billion IDIQ contract ceiling, 8 years
- **Procurement and Supply Management Project**
 - \$9.5 billion IDIQ contract ceiling, 8 years
 - Key Task Orders
 - HIV and AIDS (PEPFAR)
 - Malaria (PMI)
 - Population & Reproductive Health (USAID Global Health)
 - Maternal and Child Health (proposal submitted)
- First 5 years:
 - \$4.5 billion for commodities
 - \$700 million for technical assistance
